## **About the Program**

Dental diseases are the most prevalent chronic conditions in the United States and the major cause of loss of teeth in children and adolescents. Schools play a considerable role in the delivery of dental services to children. The school dental health program in Pennsylvania is an integral part of the total school health program. The goal of the Hazleton Area School District Dental Hygiene Services Program is to educate the student in proper oral care, prevention of oral disease and sustaining good health.

The program requires the completion of dental examinations by a school certified dental hygienist licensed within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

## <u>Permission forms will be distributed at school for the parent / guardian to select one of the following options:</u>

1. SCHOOL CERTIFIED DENTAL HYGIENIST - Throughout the course of the school year the the school certified dental hygienist from the Hazleton Area Career Center will provide exams to all who wish to participate. This includes all private schools. Permission forms will be sent home a few weeks prior to the dental visit. On top portion of <a href="Permission Form (English)">Permission Form (Spanish)</a> select the line indication that you would like your child examined by the HASD Dental Provider.

The dental hygienist uses a sterilized mouth mirror and dental explorer to complete the examination. All standard precautions, including gloves and mask, are used by the hygienist. At the screening, a <u>dental report (English)</u>; <u>dental report (Spanish)</u> will be sent home informing parent / guardian of the condition of the child's mouth. In addition, in every students file that was seen by the School Certified Dental Hygienist, the <u>School Dental Health Record Form (Commonwealth of Pennsylvania - Department of Health) is retained.</u>

2. <u>Private Dentist</u>- Student will have routine check-up performed at their own private dentist. The <u>Private Dentist Form</u> must be taken to family dentist at the regular visit and returned to your child's school. On top portion of the Permission Form select private dentist and list name of your child's family dentist. The bottom portion of permission form or the private dentist form must be taken to family dentist to be completed.

#### \*\*<u>All permission Forms MUST BE RETURNED</u> to your child's school.

#### **Examinations include:**

#### **Kindergarten:**

Students will learn about the importance of their teeth, loss of baby teeth, plaque, proper tooth brushing and healthy snacks. At the dental exam, students will receive toothbrushes, mouthwash, and dental floss.

#### 3rd Grade:

Students will learn the parts of their teeth, types of teeth, chain of tooth decay and plaque. Students will also discuss what occurs at dental visits and how to maintain healthy teeth for the rest of their life. At the dental exam, students will receive toothbrushes, mouthwash, and dental floss.

#### 7th Grade:

Students will review all items discussed at Third Grade level along with proper oral hygiene and good dietary eating habits. Proper flossing and brushing techniques will be reviewed. At the dental exam, students will receive toothbrushes, mouthwash and dental floss.



### **Dental Health Program**

Dental examinations are statemandated for students upon original entry to school (Kindergarten), in third grade and seventh grade.

This examination may be provided by the school district in which the family resides or through a family's private dentist.

The Hazleton Area School District offers the services of the dental hygienist free of charge to provide an examination and complete the required paperwork at no cost.

\*Dental records are maintained on students who were seen every year they are in attendance in the public school system.
