# **Recipient Responsibilities**

- . Must maintain a 3.25 CGPA and a four year or less graduation schedule.
- Must earn fourteen credit hours each fall semester and thirty credit hours each academic year excluding summer school.
- 3. Graduate students must maintain a 3.50 CGPA and maintain their approved. Graduation Schedule.

To be fair to all recipients we will not make exceptions to the Scholarship Criteria or to Deadlines.

## **Scholarship Particulars**

- 1. The scholarship disbursement amount, up to \$7,500 each semester, will be determined by HSF by taking the Total Cost of Attendance including tuition, fees, room, board, books, supplies, personal and transportation costs; then deducting the total dollar amount of ALL scholarships, awards, grants, waivers, Federal and institution provided work study, and one-half of recipient's FAFSA SAI. Parents are not required to pay the SAI, it is used only to determine the disbursement amount.
- The disbursement amount will be adjusted each semester to offset the expiration or loss of other scholarships, awards, grants, waivers, Federal or institution work-study, and changes in the recipient's FAFSA SAI.
- 3. The scholarship is renewable for up to seven additional consecutive semesters if the recipient fulfills the scholarship criteria and mandatory workshop responsibilities.
- 4. First year recipients receive \$2,000 prior to college enrollment to purchase essential items for college not covered by the scholarship; computer, printer, cell phone, clothing, office supplies, etc.
- 5. Second year recipients will be provided with an HSF Schwab Brokerage Account to manage until graduation. HSF funds managed by each recipient will be \$10,000 the second year, \$15,000 the third year, and \$20,000 the fourth year.
- 6. Third year recipients achieving a 3.50 CGPA are eligible for an all-expense paid study and travel abroad experience worth up to \$8,000 or the funds can be used to study abroad for one semester.
- 7. Recipients must work 240 hours from January 1, 2025 until September 1, 2025. Work must be regularly scheduled employment performed under supervision for compensation. Employment can be full-time or part-time.
- 8. Recipients graduating college while in the Hagan Scholarship Program can apply for a Hagan Graduate Scholarship, good for up to four additional consecutive semesters receiving up to \$7,500 each semester.
- 9. There is no application fee or processing fee.

How much is the Hagan Scholarship worth?

Other Benefits, Regardless of Financial Need:

1. Free Workshops to learn important life skills

2. First Year: \$2,000 to purchase essential items for college.

- 3. Second Year: \$100 to establish a Personal Schwab Brokerage Account. \$10,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage.
- 4. Third Year: \$15,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage. Up to \$8,000 to Study/Travel abroad.
- 5. Fourth Year: \$20,000 HSF Schwab Account to manage.
- 6. Graduation: Recipients will receive all gains in their managed HSF Schwab Accounts up to \$10,000, and a Graduation Package including a Certificate of Achievement. Walnut Plaques will also be awarded for exceptional achievement.

Is this a need-based or merit-based scholarship? BOTH. Applicants must authenticate genuine financial need in order to attend college. Recipients are selected based upon academic ability, personal goals, and achievements in and out of school.
